General Reports

SCHOLASTIC DEPARTMENT.

The school work has been progressing in a very creditable manner under the direction of Mr. John C. Brennan, Principal, and his staff of able assistants. In connection with the regular school work a gymnastic exercise has been instituted, which the children seem to enjoy very much and which cannot help but be of benefit to them.

Perhaps it would not be out of place to mention here what some of the former pupils have accomplished. Miss Flora B. Tallchief graduated from here in 1902 and entered the Geneseo Normal School a year after. She graduated from there in February of 1908, and immediately secured a position in one of the schools on this reservation at a salary of \$8 per week.

Miss Molly B. Jemison, who entered the Oswego Normal School in 1904, graduated from there last June. Before graduating she accepted a position in the Spring Valley High School at a salary of \$500 per year. Miss Jemison graduated from here in 1901, after which she had three years in Lima Seminary before entering the normal school. While in Lima she was graduated in vocal music and had a salaried position in one of the church choirs in Oswego nearly all the time she was at the normal school.

At present Miss Salina Maybee is attending Geneseo Normal School and Mr. Leroy Beeman is at the Fredonia Normal School. We also have four pupils preparing to enter normal schools. It seems to me as though the progress that these pupils have made cannot help but be an inspiration to the others.

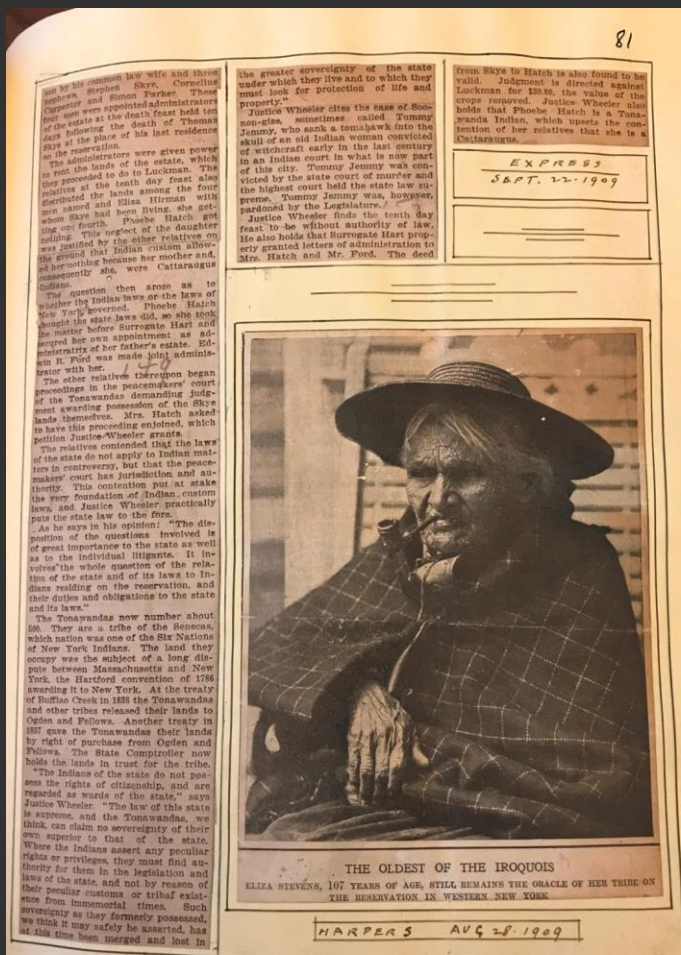

Erie County Poor House Ledgers



The Erie County Poorhouse of Buffalo, NY and succeeding institutions known as the Erie County Alms House, Erie County Hospital, and Erie County Home & Infirmary, operated as a social safety net for the region's poor and infirm. From 1851 to 1926, the Poorhouse was located on Main Street in Buffalo, the current site of the University at Buffalo's South Campus. The records consist of intake ledgers (children "bound out" 1864-1868, adults 1861-1864,

1871-1889, 1908-1923) and death registers (1897-1952).



George Nathan Newman Collection of Photographs of Vanishing Buffalo



The George Nathan Newman Collection of Photographs of Vanished and Vanishing Buffalo is a multi-volume photo album containing images of Buffalo's and the surrounding area's rich local history. The images are black-and-white reprints of Buffalo and the region

primarily from the 1800s and early 1900s. The photos capture buildings (theaters, businesses, residences) and streets in Buffalo and the Niagara region that no longer exist or have changed beyond recognition.

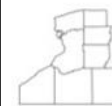

REPORT :

The Committee on Invalid Pensions, to whom was referred the petition of William Parker, report :

That the petitioner, an Indian of the Seneca tribe, was placed on the pension list, by special act of Congress of May 19, 1824, at the rate of four dollars per month; he now prays to have it increased to eight dollars, "because his disability since the granting of said pension, has, by means of advanced age, become much more aggravated than it was, when said pension was granted."

In this case there is no evidence whatever, except the petition itself; the committee, therefore, report unfavorably.
